## **CAMP DETAILS**

Date: August 18 - 22, 2025

#### Location

Edmonton, Alberta

## Chaperones

The participating students must be accompanied by a parent or chaperone from their community, both to and from a local departure point and throughout the duration of the camp.

## Cost

All costs for participants, including travel, meals and accommodation will be covered by ISC/CIRNAC. Travel costs for a parent or chaperone to bring the participant to the local departure point, including accommodation and meals where necessary, will also be provided by Regions.

## Safety

Students must be accompanied by a parent/chaperone to a local departure point.

A chaperone or other camp representatives will meet and travel with the students from the local departure point.

In the event that scheduling requires a participant to fly unaccompanied, the airline will be made aware that it is a juvenile travelling unaccompanied, so that supervision will be provided in the airport and while boarding and leaving the aircraft.

Chaperones and/or camp staff will meet the students upon arrival in specific locations and sites will be confirmed at a later date. The chaperones will accompany the students to the camp accommodations and will stay with them at all times.

When returning home, the chaperones will accompany the students at the airport until they are picked up by their family member/chaperone at the local departure point.

- Aug 17: Travel to Edmonton
- Aug 18: Orientation, travel to Elk Island, set up camp
- Aug 19: Elk Island activities (canoeing, star teaching, medicine picking, hiking etc.)
- Aug 20: Take down camp, travel back to Edmonton, Edmonton activity (museum, science
- centre), free time in the evening
- Aug 21: Travel early morning to Jasper, full slate of activities, travel back to Edmonton in evening
- Aug 22: Full day of activities in Edmonton
- Aug 23: Travel day back to home region

## **APPLICATION PROCESS**

## Who can apply?

First Nation and Inuit students aged 15 -17, ordinarily resident on reserve or in recognized communities or on community lands, and enrolled full-time in a council operated, federal, provincial/territorial recognized school (includes private schools and home schooling). Applicants must have demonstrated an interest in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics.

## What is required to apply?

Applicants must submit a resume and **one (1)** of the following options of creative work and provide 3-5 sentences artist statement describing their work:

A: Multi Media (photograph, video, website page, vlog, tiktok, recorded song, recorded spoken word, slow motion animation, voiceover video or game clip, advertisement, etc.)

**B: Written** (poem, essay, song, letter, review, play, feedback, article, advertisement, meme, comic, title page, review, Powerpoint, rant, etc.)

**C:** Visual (drawing, painting, beadwork, sewing/fabric art, collage, sculpting, installation art, tattoo art, postcard, comic, meme, advertisement, poster, etc.)

**E: Performing Arts** (in person or recorded story-telling, dance performance, song or musical art, dramatic performance, narration, spoken word, poetry, digital sound recording, etc.)

## Big Idea/Guiding Question:

Imagine and describe a job that may exist in the future that doesn't exist today based on the discoveries of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics. What is the job description and what skills, training, and other competencies does it require? How does it reflect the changing needs of the workforce and the world?
